Sharps are objects that can puncture the skin such as pen needles, syringes and the lancets used to test your blood glucose. It is very important these objects are disposed properly and in accordance to the law. Your county Health Department in conjunction with the private sector have designated sites to obtain sharp containers and you can bring them back when the container is 3/4 full for their disposal.
